Methodological notes:

- **Topline results reported are based on only the Catholic respondents in each country.** While Q6 and Q46 were asked of the entire population in the survey, the Q47 battery was only asked of Catholics in each country. The full survey is based on national samples. For further details on sample designs, refer to the <u>report's Methodology section</u> and our <u>international survey methods database</u>.
- Not all questions included in the Spring 2024 Global Attitudes Survey are presented in this topline. Omitted questions have either been previously released or will be released in future reports.
- Trend information in the United States is available in <u>the topline for the previous report on</u> <u>U.S. Catholics</u>. However, some of the trends presented there are for the general population, not just Catholics.
